



Napoleon Avenue Wharf Expansion

New Orleans, LA

Boh Bros. completed the restoration and expansion of the Napoleon Avenue Wharf. Expansion of the wharf, which was originally constructed in the 1900s, is part of a long term plan to increase the port's capacity. The expansion included demolition of sections of the old wharf as well as moving the dock 60 ft. farther into the river. This move enabled the dock to accommodate two additional cranes for container handling. Boh Bros. poured 5,190 cubic yards of concrete caps, drove 1,642 piles, powered 5,740 cubic yards of in-place deck, and installed 2,300 linear feet of railroad rails and 2,400 linear feet of crane rails.
